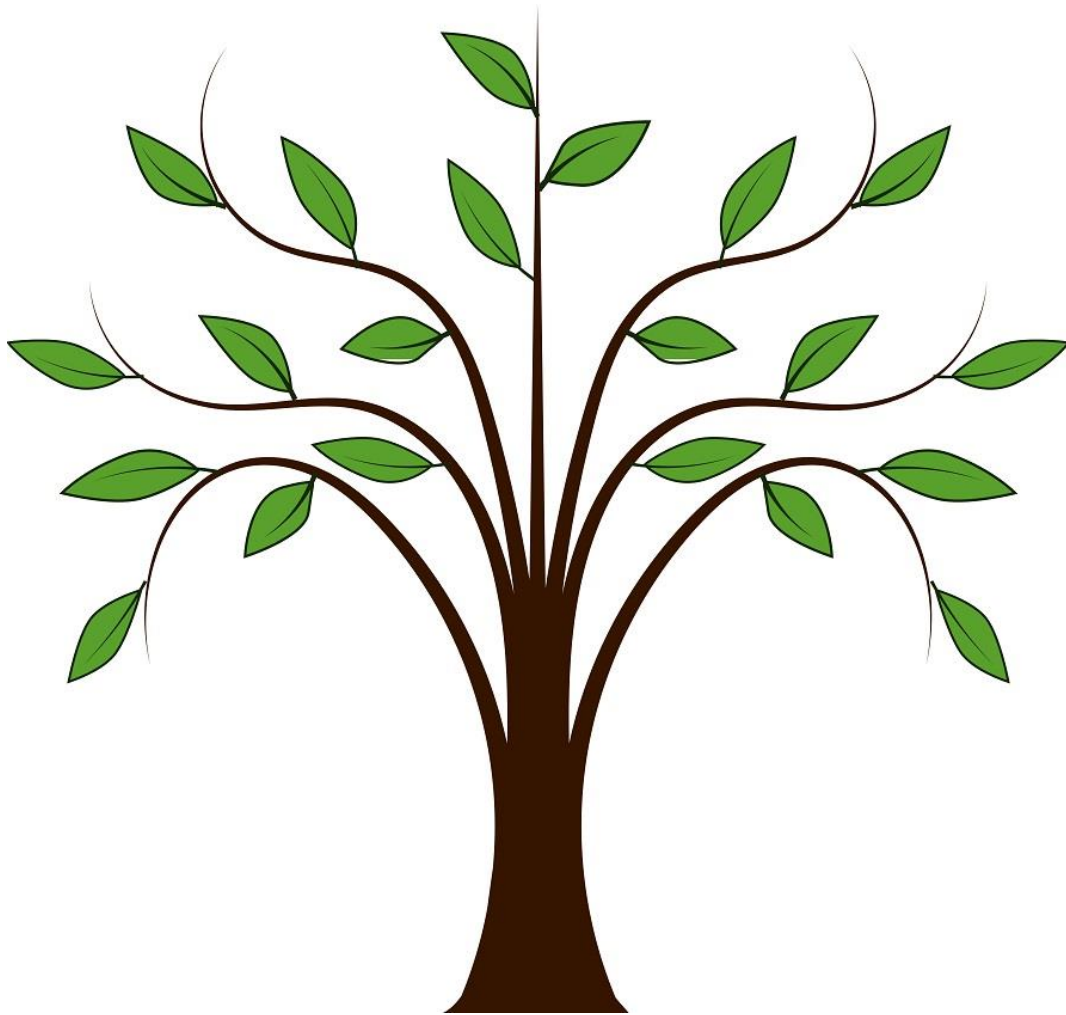

Forward

The research for this project began at different times by Taryn DiTomasso, Karl F. Miller, and Mark Edward Jackson. This research project would not be possible without the dedicated research by Taryn DiTomasso and the late James Ceylon Jackson 1888-1992.

The intent of this project is to learn more about the Jackson's of central New York that settled southwest of Syracuse sometime between 1806 and 1811 and beyond. And, to also identify and locate other descendants of James Jackson. We also hope this project will benefit future generations.

The deadline for publishing this research project has been self-imposed as we realized that if we simply continued researching, the inevitable would surely occur and future generations would be left with only a cabinet full of poorly filed documents and notes.

Most assuredly there are errors and omissions herein and we hope the readers will inform us about them. We do think this is a reasonable presentation of the descendants of James Jackson and Ruth Ellison. It is our desire that this research project will give pleasure to all and to be a source of information for the future family members.

If health and time allows, we plan to continue this research and produce a second version at a some not-too-distant time that will include corrections and additions. Your corrections and additions will be most welcome and will be included therein. If you are a descendant of James Jackson 1775-1811, we would love to hear from you.

Introduction

At this point in our research when we decided to accumulate our sundry notes, documents, and pictures and present them in the form of a series of research papers, we began thinking about how to best accomplish this.

Most of us, during our educational endeavors, were required to write several essays and themes. With only this brief exposure to authorship, we found ourselves in quite a quandary trying to decide how to organize all this material and how to present it in a manner that would be interesting and informative to the readers.

Compounding this problem was the realization that the readers would no doubt have many different levels of interest in this material. There will surely be some whose interest lies only in their immediate family and anyone beyond their great grandfather will be of no concern. Others will examine all the charts in detail and hunger for more. The format upon which we have settled may not totally satisfy everyone, but it is the result of a sincere attempt to accommodate each person's interest in the family.

The reader will quickly note that much more information appears around some relatives than others. This is not due to any intent on our part, but simply to the reasons mentioned in the Foreword, the self-imposed deadline to publish this research project and, to only plain luck.

As we mentioned in the Foreword, we do plan to return to research as soon as this work is "off the press" and we hope that some readers will contact us regarding individuals and additional information to include in the next version.

In addition to their relationship to others in this file, the basic information we wanted to secure about each person was their full name, date, and place of birth, date and place of marriage, date, and place of death, where buried (name of cemetery), where they live, occupation, their branch of service, the college they attended, their nickname, and their religious preference. We also looked for any unusual events or accomplishments in their lives that we felt would be of interest to others. The omission of some or all the above items for many listed herein should not be construed as not being applicable, but simply due to the reasons mentioned above.

The format used for the lineage charts has been created by Family Tree Maker (The Software MacKiev Company - www.mackiev.com). We believe the format of the charts is easily understood, however, if you have a question feel free to contact us.

Each fact in this research project is not annotated, however, the sources of our information are listed on the "Contributors and Compilers" page. The notes that we worked with did not include annotations. Hopefully, this will placate our "purist" friends to some extent.

James Jackson 1775-1811 (Generation 1)

James Jackson was born in London, England on May 6, 1775. James Jackson emigrated to America in early life. Little is known about his parents. Thomas Jackson (abt1744-) and Mary Townsend of Windrush, England are possibly his parents. Records indicate that Thomas and Mary were married on October 14, 1769 in Windrush, England.

James Jackson and Ruth Ellison were married about 1795.

Little is known about Ruth Ellison except that she was born in the Mohawk Valley Region (possibly in Albany, NY) in approximately 1780. Dates of birth, names of parents and siblings are unfortunately not known.

James Jackson and Ruth Ellison lived in Duanesburg, Schenectady County, New York and then moved to Onondaga County, New York in approximately 1806, settling in Halls Corners (now known as Navarino) after James originally came to the county first and acquired land and built the log cabin. It is thought that James Jackson acquired land from Azariah Hall (1756-1832). He supposedly purchased land from Hall's grant of at least 500 acres. James Jackson is listed on the tax rolls for Onondaga County in 1806.

James Jackson was a blacksmith by trade and his blacksmith shop was located on the south side of current day Route 20, in a peach orchard next to a tavern. The state road was then a crude dirt road approximately where Route 20/Cherry Valley turnpike now lie.

James Jackson died on the 14th of September 1811 in Navarino, New York at the age of 36 years old. He was believed to be buried on his property at Hall's corners and that his remains were later moved to the Jackson Family Cemetery. It is said that James was the first to be buried in the cemetery; his gravestone indicates that this is the case. We are unsure when the cemetery was first established. In of April 2012, Jackson Family Researcher Taryn DiTomasso uncovered James Jackson's gravestone under four inches of earth in the Jackson Cemetery which was an especially important find.

At the time of James' death, Ruth was in her thirties with six children all of which were under the age of 15 and had no means to support them. She married Jude Comstock soon after James' death and they had one daughter named Olive Comstock. It is believed that they resided at Hall's Corners until 1825. Then they procured land in the town of Marcellus, the southeast corner or military lot #43. This property is now on New Town Road about 1/4 miles north of Route 20. There is a marsh in its center formally known as Beaver's pond and this property was sold on the 7th of October 1842 to Ruth's son John Jackson and John Wiltsie for \$2500. Jude Comstock and Ruth Ellison signed the deed with their "marks" at the time that they signed the deed they were living in Ridgeway, NY.

It is believed that Martha Comstock, who married Ruth's son William Jackson, was Jude Comstock's daughter from a previous marriage to Janet Baker. On the 1880 United States Federal Census, it states that both of Olive's parents were born in Connecticut. Which I have records stating that her father Jude Comstock's whole family was from Kent, Connecticut. Ruth was living with William and Martha Jackson until she died in Ridgeway, Orleans County, New York on the 26th of February 1862. This is verified by a telegram from William to Amos stating that: "Mother died this morning." The telegram was dated the 28th of February 1862 and her death was further verified by a letter from Amos to his brother John.

Hopefully, time and circumstances will permit us to learn more about James Jackson and Ruth Ellison.

James Jackson, Jr. 1798-1892 (Generation 2)

James Jackson, Jr. was born on March 29, 1798 in Duaneburg, Schenectady County, New York. His parents were James Jackson, Sr., and Ruth Ellison.

James Jackson, Jr. married Marie Marlette in 1819 in Onondaga County, New York.

Marie Marlette was born on November 15, 1797 in Montgomery, New York.

James was the first of three children to make the move to Ridgeway, Orleans County, New York in 1823 when it was still a wilderness. They settled on lot 20 Township 15, range 4, where they resided since. They had 10 children, 6 sons and 4 daughters. Two sons and three daughters settled close by in or near Medina, New York.

He has been a successful farmer, overcoming by sturdy industry the obstacles of sickness, hardship, and the privations of new country by which he has been beset.

James Jackson, Jr. passed away on January 16, 1892 in Ridgeway, Orleans County, New York, and he was buried in the Boxwood Cemetery in Ridgeway, Orleans County, New York.

Cemetery records say N, D, and Vet of the Civil War of Co. B. 118th Illinois Infantry. Next was Henry O. Jr. was born in 1872 and died in 1903. Henry is also buried in Oak Hill Cemetery in Iowa. Ralph W. was born in 1875; Ralph at the age of 10 years was noted in the South Dakota Territorial Census of 1885. Ruth was born on the 6th of May 1883, and died on the 17th of August 1954 in Brevard Co, Transylvania, N.C. Ruth married Andrew I. Keener. Burt and Myrtle had another son Henry Spencer Jackson, he was born in 1890 in Iowa. Burt and Myrtle's next son was Clarence Van Jackson he was born in 1903 in Iowa, and married Edith Myrtle McMillen, she was born in 1905 in Iowa, and died in February 1901. She was the daughter of Samuel P. and Ida May Ford. Along with Edith, they had another daughter Esther, and a son named Fred.

Wesley Jackson 1833-1886 (Generation 3)

Wesley Jackson was born in June 1832 and died on the 10th of May 1891, fifth child of James and Marie Marlette Jackson, He married Frances Moore born on the 20th of June 1832 she was from Medina. They married around 1855, they had four children, Wesley James Jackson was born on the 23rd of September 1856, Annie G. Jackson born in 1859, and Carl Henry born on the 26th of January 1870 in Oregon. Wesley and Francis moved to Portland, Oregon not long after their marriage. Wesley James was born in the East and Annie was born in California. Both Carl Henry and the youngest child were born in Oregon.

The following is an excerpt from Portrait and Biographical Record of Portland and Vicinity Oregon: To the pioneers of Oregon the present generation owes a debt of gratitude that will never be paid. They were men who were men who were truly cast in heroic mold. Few had money, and it certainly required a sturdy nature and a perseverance that today is rarely found in men. Men in 1850 were known for their true worth. All were animated by a common hope the confidence in the future of Oregon was great. There were noble men and too much cannot be said or done in their honor. To this class of men, belonged the gentleman whose name forms the caption for this review. A native of New York, his birth occurred in the village of Medina, and here the days of his boyhood and youth passed. A few weeks of the year were spent in the schoolroom, but in those days the services of the youth were of too much value to be wasted in school. He was needed to assist in the work on the farm. Attracted by the discovery of gold in California, Mr. Jackson left his home in 1849 and joined and joined the thousands who were emigrating westward. San Francisco was reached after a long and tedious voyage around the horn, and the following year was spent in mining on McCamel Hill. At the end of this time, with the capitol he had accumulated, Mr. Jackson came to Portland on the vessel Ajax, and soon after his arrival he opened a crockery store. From a very small beginning, he gradually built up a business that was not only the largest in the city of Portland but was one of the most important of its kind in the Pacific Northwest. Each year for a considerable period he would go east and purchase his supply of goods and at the same time he would also buy in large quantities for other firms in different lines of business. Mr. Jackson continued in this line of business until 1883 and during this time he became one of the best-known businessmen in the west.

His reputation was an enviable one and the success that crowned his efforts was but the natural results of diligence, enterprise and honesty. On disposing of his crockery business in 1883. He recognized and established the North Pacific Manufacturing Company, which under his judicious and efficient oversight became one of the most efficient oversights became one of the most important industries in the city of Portland. The plant was constructed under his personal supervision and the company engaged in the manufacture of buggies, carriages, and wagons, transacting a business that aggregated \$100.000 per annum. From the plant the Jackson Vehicles were shipped to all parts of the country, particularly through Oregon, Idaho, and Washington. It is worthy of note that here were manufactured the first street cars used on the Pacific coast, which were run on the streets of Portland. To assist them in the production of their high-grade vehicles, hardwood lumber was ordered from the east and reached here via the Horn. However, the establishment and oversight of so large a business overtaxed the physical powers of the founder and owner, and his sudden death, on the 10th of May 1891, was a direct result of overwork.

While Mr. Jackson was at all times a man who had many business matters to occupy his attention, he nevertheless was one of the most public-spirited citizens of Portland. No movement that was

calculated to be of material benefit to the city went by without his support. His time and means were always at the disposal of any interest deserving the support of good citizens. Among the many enterprises with which he was connected was the Portland Telephone Exchange, which he aided in starting. He was also actively identified with the Transcontinental Line. Fraternally he was a mason and politically he supported the men and measures of the Republican Party, but he never had the time or the inclination to take an active part in the political struggles of his party. He was ever on the side of right and when called upon he always responded.

While still a resident of Medina, NY. Mr. Jackson was united in marriage with Frances Moore, a native of that city and now a resident of Portland. Three children were born of this union, as follows: Wesley James who died in 1876, while attending school at Andover, Mass. While studying to be a Presbyterian minister: Annie G., now Mrs. Shofner of Portland, and Carl Henry.

Maria B. Jackson was born in December of 1835 and died in 1912 she was the daughter of James and Marie Marlette Jackson. She married Rufus Munson Grummon who was born in 1837, died on the 29th of March 1889. They had three children: Lewis M. Grummon born on the 10th of June 1859, and Lizzie born on the 10th of October 1861 and died on the 14th of June 1871, and Julia Gertrude Grummon was born on the 24th of June 1871 in Medina, and died on the 7th of August 1945 in Yates, NY. Julia married Orrin M. Curson, he was born on the 1st of November 1857 in Shelby, NY, and died on the 24th of January 1941. Julia and Orrin had one son, George Melvin Curson he was born on the 30th of January 1895 in Medina, and died on the 11th of December 1944 in Lockport, NY. Orrin was the son of George H. Curson he was born in 1830 and died on the 18th of December 1918. Orrin married Mary A. Gotts, she was born in 1838, and died on the 13th of June 1905 in Yates, NY. Then when he transferred, he went to Company K. 91st NY Infantry, on the 5th of June 1865, and mustered out on the 3rd of July 1865 in Washington, D.C. After the war he wandered and from the 6th of December 1886-till the 29th of June 1887. He was in the U.S. National Homes for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers. He stayed in these homes off and on for several years because of his Rheumatism, until his death on the 8th of January 1897. He died from Pulmonary Tuberculosis. He is buried in the Dayton National Cemetery, in Dayton, Montgomery County, Ohio, USA Plot 19,19, Findagrave # 1258513.

William Jackson 1799-1890 (Generation 2)

William Jackson (1799-1890) was born on October 21, 1799 in Duanesburg, Schenectady County, New York. He was the second son of James and Ruth Ellison Jackson.

William married Martha Comstock on June 20, 1822.

Martha Comstock was born in 1806 and died on the January 4, 1871.

In 1826 William went to Ridgeway, Orleans County, New York where he purchased an article of one hundred acres of land in Ridgeway, part of lots 21, township 15, and range 4 where he built a log cabin and later returned to Onondaga County, New York to bring his family back to Ridgeway to their new home in February of 1827. His new home was without a door or window or floor when he moved into it. Blankets were good substitutes for doors and windows after he fixed the floor and door they lived comfortably. Prosperity attended his labor in a short time as he bought more land, which he fitted and cultivated into one of the finest farms in the county.

William and Martha either had 9 or 11 children. At the time of the writing of this book, only nine children can be identified.

After Martha's passing on January 4, 1871, William remarried at some point later to Charlotte. At the time of writing this book, no other information was available about William's second wife Charlotte.

William died on October 31, 1890 in Holley, Orleans County, New York and was laid to rest at the Hillside Cemetery in Clarendon, Orleans County, New York.

William Jackson Obituary: William Jackson, the oldest resident of this village (Holley) died Friday evening, aged 91 years. The surviving sons and daughters are Orange L. Jackson of Onondaga, Edwin R. Jackson of Holley; Mrs. Polly Ostrom of Albion, MI; Mrs. E. Hunt of Medina, NY; Mrs. J. B. Knapp of Homer, Michigan, and Mrs. Celia Brown, of Tennessee. Three brothers, James, and Benjamin of Medina; Amos of Syracuse and one sister, Mrs. Clarinda Wiley of Danville.

It is believed that Martha Comstock, who married Ruth Ellison Jackson's son William Jackson, was Jude Comstock's daughter from a previous marriage to Janet Baker which I found to be true. On the 1880 United States Federal Census, it states that both of Olive's parents were born in Connecticut. Which I have records stating that her father Jude Comstock's whole family was from Kent, Connecticut. Ruth Ellison Jackson Comstock was living with William Jackson and Martha Comstock Jackson until she died in Ridgeway, NY on the 26th of February 1862. This is verified by a telegram from William Jackson to Amos Jackson stating that: "Mother died this morning." The telegram was dated the 28th of February 1862 her death was further verified by a letter from William Jackson's brother Amos Jackson to his brother John Jackson.

W.H. Knapp - One of the leading Agriculturists of the Tehachapi Valley, has been a resident of California since 1875. He is a native of Medina, N.Y. born May 9, 1853, son of E.H. & Jane (Jackson) Knapp, both natives of the empire state and members of pioneer families. The farmer by occupation removed from New York to Walworth County, Wisconsin, where he had lived about ten years; in 1870 he went to Homer, Calhoun County, Michigan.

W.H. Knapp had received a good common school education and at Homer learned Telegraphy. After his arrival in California, he spent one season in Napa City and in Alai in 1876, he was tendered a position as telegraph operator at Tulare. He remained there, however, only one month and was then assigned to the Tehachapi Station. The Southern Pacific railroad was then in course of construction and the present thriving town of Tehachapi consisted of Mr. Knapp's operating office, 7x9 feet, and a few tents pitched by the railroad company. With an eye to future resources of this valley.

Mr. Knapp took note of the great fertility of the soil and the delightful climate and decided to make a practical farmer's test. In 1877, he pre-empted eighty acres of government land and sowed it to barley. The result being a revelation to him and to the stock rangers who had Trans versed the county for several years. To his pre-emption claim he has added until he has now 480 acres adjoining town. He has set out 180 fruit trees and has some fine improvements on his property. In 1888, he resigned his position as agent for the Southern Pacific railroad Company at Tehachapi station and now devotes his time and attention to his personal interests.

Mr. Knapp was married December 24, 1878 to Miss. Sierra Nevada Williams, daughter of a (page 316) California Pioneer, the tall James E. Williams. She was born in Visalia, December 2, 1863 and lived with her parents in the first hotel which was built by them at Old Town, about 2 miles from the present town of Tehachapi. Mr. & Mrs. Knapp have three children: James Edmund was born November 15, 1881 and died on the 20th of April 1979 in San Francisco; CA. James Edmund married Mabel McKibben, she was born on the 28th of August 1884 in Conway Springs, Kansas, and she died on the 3rd of May 1974 in San Francisco. James and Mabel had two sons: William Robert Knapp, he was born on the 3rd of March 1915 in San Francisco, and died on the 27th of January 2010 in Greenbrae; Marin County, CA. There second son was James G. Knapp born on the

Gertrude was born on May 13, 1884 and died on the 13th of October 1777. Gertrude married Edwin M. Prescott in Los Angeles. Gertrude and Edwin had two sons that I have found so far. First was Frank Kendrick born in 1913 in California and Phillip J. was born in 1915 in California.

Mr. Knapp is one of Tehachapi's most thrifty citizens and a member of the town school board.

William H. Knapp, pioneer telegrapher for the Southern Pacific and the first agent at Tehachapi, died March 25, following a lingering illness. The death of Knapp took place at his home at 3343 Kerckhoff Avenue, which was recently completed. W.H. Knapp was born May 9, 1851 in Medina, NY and came to California in 1876, and accepted a position as telegrapher at Goshen Junction. Later, Knapp moved to Tehachapi where he lived for 10 years. He acted in the capacity as agent for the Southern Pacific. He was the first agent in the railroad town. Knapp then retired and planted one of the first orchards in Tehachapi. He came to Fresno four years ago and had made his home in this city since that time. He is survived by his wife, a son, and two daughters.

John Jackson 1801-1880 (Generation 2)

John Jackson (1801-1880) was born on May 6, 1801 in Duanesburg, Schenectady County, New York. He was the third son of James and Ruth Ellison Jackson.

John Jackson was a farmer and had an extremely large family. Some accounts have John with as many as 23 children. J. Ceylon Jackson's g-g-grandmother, Mary Ann, put the number at 17. Below 18 children from 3 wives are listed.

J. Ceylon Jackson, in "Memoirs of Oak Hill," says there is little known of John from his early life. "Little is known of John's boyhood. He is said to have worked a year before his marriage for which he received one-hundred dollars. At the time of his marriage to Almira Balch, the daughter of John Balch, a neighbor, he acquired a small piece of land near the settlement then known as 'Bumble Bee City' of 'State Road.' He added to his holdings from time to time, until at his death his homestead consisted of between two and three hundred acres. He raised a large family and provided each of his children with a home when they married."

James Jackson died when John was just 10 years old.

There is evidence that John attended school. There was a stone school which was the first school established in the area. The school was located on the state road on the Marcellus/Onondaga line.

John was said to have worked a year when he was about 20 years old, for which he received \$100.00.

John Married Almira Balch in December of 1824. John's older brother James married in 1819 and took his family to Orleans County in 1823 and settled in the town of Ridgeway, New York. James persuaded two of his brothers to join him in Orleans County, but John chose to live near his boyhood home. In the spring, following his marriage he acquired 10 acres of land from Samuel Smith. The land was comparatively level, fertile farmland; it was situated in the town of Marcellus. It was a part of military lot #49, the land was at least partially cleared and may have had a log cabin built on it. They lived in this cabin or one John had built until 1834. John then built a large, framed house to replace the cabin. This small piece of land became the nucleus of his farm, where he lived the remainder of his life.

John Jackson's farm was the next one last from Jim Buskirk. He had four wives and the names of his children were legendary. He farmed his broad acres year after year. Every time a son or daughter was married, he gave them more than a substantial start in life. Aunt Harriet worked as hard as Uncle John to clothe and feed the children.

John Jackson died on September 28, 1880 in Navarino, Onondaga, New York was buried in the Jackson Family Cemetery in Navarino, Onondaga County, New York.

Obituary, Marcellus Observer, September 30, 1880, page 3, and October 14, 1880: (Contributed by Jodell McVey)

John Jackson was born in Schoharie County, May 6, 1801. He moved with his parents to this county (Onondaga) in 1806. In 1824 he married Almira Balch of Tully the same year he purchased and moved onto the farm upon which he died (in Marcellus). In 1831 he married Fatima Earl of Otisco, in 1843, Harriet Douglas of Marcellus, in 1876, Caroline (Earl) Amidon. The following children are left ... Clarinda, wife of William Amidon, Amos of Jordan, NY (near Elbridge, NY),

Mary, wife of Charles Gambell, Ann Jane, wife of E. (Duane) Wiltsie, Fatima, wife of George Fellows, Mortimer (James M.) who now lives on the homestead (apparently only lived on homestead for last year of John's life – home was at Oak Hill – Otisco), Alvaretta, wife of A.D. Clary, now of Dewitt, MI, Abbie, wife of F. Ramsden. Nine children are deceased (for a total of 16 by this accounting). ... His brothers, James, aged 82, William, 81, Benjamin, 77 and Amos, 74, and sister, Clarinda 73, now survive him.

His daughter's obituary (Mary Ann Jackson) says he fathered 17 children by three wives (Note: 1934 newspaper article also cites 17 children for John Jackson). He bought the first 10 acres for his farm from Seth Smith on Military Lot 49 of the Town of Marcellus on May 31, 1825. The location was near the eastern limits of Bumblebee City, near the township line between Marcellus on the west and Onondaga on the east. He continued to enlarge the farm, in 1836 buying a 49-acre parcel just across the township-line in Onondaga. Eventually, the farm encompassed over 300 acres, including most of what had become Bumblebee City. In 1834 he replaced an earlier log cabin with a frame house. The farm is a mile west of Navarino just over the town line of Onondaga and contains the so-called Jackson Family Cemetery. In 1990 it was the Wayne Norris farm, and the cemetery was badly overgrown with trees and had been used as a dumping spot for rocks and stones from surrounding fields.

A township contained 60,000 acres. Township NO 9 was Marcellus. Each township was divided into one hundred Military Farm Lots (of 600 acres). Each Military Farm Lot was further divided into smaller 100-acre sections known as State 100 Acres.

A cluster of tall trees on a knoll a few hundred feet behind the house hides the Bumblebee Cemetery which came to be known as the Jackson Family Cemetery. It was in the middle of the Jackson Farm. In its prime Bumblebee City had a church, parsonage, wagon shop, blacksmith shop and several dwellings. The church was later moved to Navarino where it served as a barn. When the 1934 article was written there were two elderly houses a mile west of Navarino. Bumblebee City was originally settled by Lewis Baker, his wife and 9 children in 1803. The Bakers had come from Pelham, MA driving a yoke of oxen. The trip took 18 days. The Bakers took up temporary lodging with a family already resident in a log cabin until their own log cabin. The Bakers are well represented in the cemetery behind the Jackson house.

Syracuse Daily Journal, August 29, 1860 article reports on a picnic held in Bumblebee City. People mentioned include Dr. Alfred Hall, Col. Bentley, Captain John Wiltsie, Rev. W.W. Bowdish, Miss Wheeler and Miss Barber from the Navarino school, James Baker, Commissioner Cowles, F.A. Lyman. Short speeches were made by F. Wright, W.W. Bowdish of the Otisco Lake school.

Nine Mile Country, the History of the Town of Marcellus, K.C. Heffernan (1978), p 202: 'Many present residents who bear the names of Jackson, Amidon, Gamble, Wiltsie, Clary, Cummings or Ramsden can trace their ancestry to Jackson.'

In posting the Jackson Family History, as compiled by J. Ceylon Jackson, I noted the following gifts from John to his surviving adult children, ordinarily at the time of their marriage (apparently, John gave each of his adult children property; J. Ceylon Jackson says they did not get possession until they had saved \$1,000):

1. To Mary Ann (and Charles Gambell), a house next to the Jackson family farm, in which Mary Ann lived from the 1870's until her death.

2. To Ann (and E. Duane Wiltsie), who lived on the opposite side of State road, a short distance west of the Jackson farm.
3. To Fatima (and George Fellows), a 50-acre farm as a wedding gift, ca 1867 (George purchased the Jackson estate in 1880 from John's 4th wife, Caroline).
4. To President (and Catherine), a 50 acre farm a mile north of Navarino.
5. To Abigail (and James Ramsden), a 49-acre part of the Jackson farm (purchased in 1836 from Cyrus Andrews).
6. To James (and Euretta), a 50-acre farm near Marcellus.

Will, September 11, 1879; Onondaga County Will Book V, pp 317+ heir's wife, Caroline; children James Mortimer, Abby Ramsey (sic), Mary Gambell, Ann Jane Wiltsie, Fatima Fellows and Alvaretta Clary. In the petition for probate other heirs were Clarinda Amidon, Abigail Ramsden), children of Andrew Jackson deceased (Dwight and Laura) and the children of Celinda Olney deceased (John Andrew and Almira).

Gave to daughter Abby Ramsey (sic, Ramsden) the use of 52 acres of land in town of Onondaga known as the old Convers farm during her life. At her death, the land would go their heirs. If she had no heirs or her children had no heirs the land would be divided among John's son, John M. Jackson, and daughters Mary Gambell, Ann Jane Wiltsie, Fatima Fellows, Alvaretta Clary. He gave \$800 to daughter Mary, \$600 to Ann Jane, \$200 to Fatima, and a promissory note made to Adelbert Clary and John Jackson John Jackson to James Redway for \$600 (\$328 unpaid) to Alvaretta. If the note was paid, then she received \$300. He gave wife Caroline the use of the rest of his estate during her life. After her death, the estate was to be divided among his children. Executors, James Mortimer Jackson, and Edmund Duane Wiltsie Witnesses, Lewis Baker of Marcellus, and James Redway of Otisco

Codicil, May 5, 1880 John revoked the \$800 he gave to Mary and instead gave here \$400 and the house in Marcellus where she resided (she continued here with (Eu)Dora until she died).

Probate petition listed Clarinda Amidon, Mary Gambell, Ann Wiltsey, Abigail Ramsden, and James M Jackson of Marcellus. Fatima Fellows was from Onondaga. Alvaretta Clary was from Dewitt, Clinton, Michigan. Amos Jackson was from Elbridge.

The children of Andrew Jackson (deceased) were Dwight Jackson and Laura Jackson of Marcellus, minors. The children of Celinda Olney (deceased) were John, Andrew, and Almira Olney, a minor, of Marcellus.

Celinda Jackson - was born on the 21st of February 1827 and died on the 15th of January 1873 at 43 years 10 months. She was the daughter of John Jackson and Alvira Balch. She married Nehemiah Olney who was born in 1825 and died on the 31st of October 1878 and had three children. She is buried in the Jackson Cemetery.

Onondaga Standard-1st of April 1846-Mrs. Celinda Jackson married at Navarino on the 28th of March 1846 by Rev. Barton Capron to Mr. Nehemiah Olney all of Onondaga County. Found the wedding announcement at the Onondaga County Historical Society. Bear with me as I explain the Olney's.

Nathan Olney was born on the 20th of November 1720 at Smithfield, Providence, Rhode Island, and died in 1788 at Saratoga Springs, NY. He married Elizabeth Goodspeed who was born on the 10th of October 1731 at Rochester, Plymouth, Massachusetts, she died also in 1788 at Saratoga Springs, Co., NY., Bethial Olney was born in 1797 in Providence, Rhode Island, and died in 1783., Zelpha Olney was born in 1770 in Saratoga, NY., and died on the 1st of October 1834 at Saratoga, NY., and their final child, Peter Olney was born on the 21st of November 1754 in Providence, Rhode Island., and died on the 16th of February 1834 in Lafayette, NY.

Peter married Tabitha Clark, she was born on the 5th of July 1752 in Killingly, Windham, Connecticut, and she died in 1845 in Sempronius, Cayuga Co., NY. Peter and Tabitha also had 7 children: Dorcas Olney was born in 1798 in Killingly, Windham, Connecticut, and died in 1814. Dorcas married a Simeon Adams who was born in 1796. They had a son, Dr. Clark William Adams who was born on the 10th of May 1824 in Syracuse, NY., and died on the 17th of March 1882 in Little Valley, Kansas.

Peter and Tabitha's next child was Nabby Olney born in Connecticut in 1800 and died in 1816. Next came Hannah Olney born in 1804, and died in 1820., Betsey Olney born in 1806, and died in 1892., Zepha Olney born in 1808 in Cuanza, Angola., Their final child Simon P. Olney was born on the 16th of October 1796 in Providence, Rhode Island, and died on the 30th of January 1878. Simon married Sally Carpenter who was born on the 8th of February 1790, and died in 1832 in Perth, Fulton, NY.

Simon and Sally also had 7 children: Nathan Olney was born on the 8th of January 1819 at Providence, Rhode Island, and died in 1892 in Sodus, Berrian Co., Michigan. A daughter, Rhoda A. Price was born in 1821, and died Berrian Co., Michigan. Their Son, Oliver Olney 10th February 1831 in Providence, Rhode Island. Oliver married Martha M. Boardman was born on the 28th of November 1833 at Ohio, and on the 11th of October 1854 in Salem, Ohio. Tabitha Olney was born on the 7th of May 1829 in Providence and died 1830.

Simon and Sally had another son Sgt. Avery Olney was born on the 6th of July 1826 in Providence, Rhode Island., a daughter, Mary Polly Olney was born on the 7th of April 1823 at Shelby, Richland, Ohio. Then Sally and Simon had Nehemiah Olney was born on the 12th of February 1821 in Providence, Rhode Island, and died on the 30th of October 1878 at Navarino. Nehemiah married Celinda A. Jackson who was born on the 21st of February 1827 in Marcellus and died on the 15th of January 1873 in Navarino.

Nememiah and Celinda had 3 children: John Jackson Olney was born on the 31st of March 1849 at South Onondaga and died on the 8th of March 1920 in Navarino. As far as John Jackson I haven't found that he married. The next son was Andrew Holland Olney who was born on the 12th of January 1858 in Onondaga. He died 6th of July 1926. He married Clara A. Whitney was born in Cayuga, in April 1838, and died on the 25th of April 1893. On the New York Civil War Claim his wife is stated as Sarah B. it says she was born in Canada.

Nememiah and Celinda had a daughter, Almyra Olney who was born in April of 1869, and died in 1945. Almyra married Everett Whitmore who was born in July 1871. They were married on the 3rd of July 1889. Almyra and Everett had four children: Glen Everett Whitmore who was born on the 22nd of July 1897 and died in October 1938. Theresa Whitmore born in January 1896, Elnora Whitmore born in August 1898, Everett's parents were George Whitmore 1845-1896 and Emma Hull in March of 1852-1904.

Andrew was a Pvt. during the Civil War he served in Charleston, SC. These are the dates he was mustered in are as follows: April 10, 1863, August 1863, October 1863, December 1863, February 1864, April 1864, and June 1864. He was in Co.D, 157 NY VOL from the 22nd of August 1862 to the 10th of July 1865. He had two children: Deforest Whitney Olney born in 1871 and Orrilla M. Olney born in 1874, both born in Cayuga.

I am not sure of the first name, but he was known as Jackson Olney, a boyhood pal of my father's was her son. Few new his name as he was known as Jack Olney, I have since found out from a distant family member Jane Ollssen that his name was John Jackson Olney. My findagrave friend Harvey dug up the Olney's I almost passed out when I saw all the graves he dug up. Thanks, so much Harvey, I do have pics of all of their graves.

Clarinda Jackson was born on the 21st of February 1827 and died on the 27th of February 1899. She was the second child of John and Alvira Balch Jackson. She married William Amidon who was born on the 14th of April 1827 and died on the 22nd of June 1889. They had a huge family of whom I only knew Myron our families were close. I attended Onondaga Valley academy with Elizabeth and Fannie, our families took turns taking us to and from school. Ambrose roomed with me and my wife in Ithaca for a few weeks in 1914. Ambrose was taking a short course in Agriculture at the University. Those taking these courses were commonly known as "Short Horns". I never met his wife or family, but my brother Donald visited his son and his family. Ambrose married the daughter of Edger Bowen, whom my brother Clermont and his wife Mary went to work for after they left Hale farm. They had twelve children: Dwight born in 1846, Oafental I. born in 1846, Almiria P. born in 1848, Eleanor born in 1849, Clarinda born in 1850, John D. was born on the 21st of December 1851, Myron D. was born on the 25th of October 1854, Mary Eva born in 1856, William Dalton was born in April 1858, Ambrose D. born 1861, Clara A. was born in September 1867, and Hattie was born March 1868. The following is her Obituary: Mrs. Amidon who died Monday, February 29, 1899 at her home in Navarino she was born on the Jackson homestead, now owed by George T. Fellows. She was born on the 21st of February 1827 her husband died on the 22nd of January 1889. Their marriage was spent in the town of Marcellus and Onondaga mostly on the farm. James Mortimer Jackson was born on the homestead of John Jackson, in Bumblebee City on the 6th of December 1847. He was the third of ten children and the first of three boys of Harriet and John. Both of father's brothers died young, Freddie lived till he was four, and President till he was 25 years old. At the time of grandfather's death in 1880, father and his half-brother Amos were the only boys alive.

Marcellus Observer-1930-By: Merrill Cates

Mort graduated at Bumblebee city and took a postgraduate at Navarino. Dr. Lounsberry taught the school at the time in Navarino. He left Mort in charge one afternoon to teach school, when he was called away. The big boys hanged him to the bell rope and every time the bell vibrated it pulled out his neck so long, I thought his head was coming off. I was scared and yelled bloody murder. I've often thought the reason I know so much is account of what I learned from Mort that one afternoon. At any rate, I've always blamed him for it.

James married Euretta VanBuskirk in 1871; grandfather purchased a 50-acre farm near the village of Marcellus for them. He gave them the deed to the farm, and after three years they sold it. With the advice and assistance of his father, they bought a 67-acre farm on Oak Hill in the town of Otisco. He lived there until 1931 (except for 1880) at which time they moved to his father's farm to care for him in his last illness. None of father's children were born on grandfather's farm except Clermont, the rest were born on the Oak Hill farm. Father and Euretta had two children Jessie and Clermont. Father lost his first wife in 1884. On the 25th of March 1886 he married Emily Amelia Hotchkiss, my mother.

The Syracuse Standard-Tuesday morning, March 30, 1886.

Navarino

J.M. Jackson and Emily Hotchkiss were married at the residence of the bride's parents on Oak Hill Thursday evening. The Rev. Mr. Smith of Navarino officiated.

At the time of this marriage, he was working the farm as well as buying tobacco, seed, and grain for Uncle Amos and his partner Charles Warner of Jordan, NY. Of this marriage there were three children: Myself (James Ceylon Jackson), then Mary, and then Donald. Mother died in childbirth on the 13th of February 1898 in childbirth, the child was unborn at the time of mother's death.

Jessie was attending the Cortland Normal School she came home and cared for us children for the next two and a half years. Father lived alone for most of the next thirty years and ran the farm. For the first few years, I, then Mary, and then Donald kept house for father and also worked on the farm until we left one by one, to attend school. In 1931, because of failing health father had an auction disposing of all of his livestock and personal property. He went to live with his grandson Alvra and Ethel Jackson, in Navarino. He spent the last few weeks of his life at the home of Ethel's mother and was

cared for by Clara Jackson and my wife, Louise. Father died on the 29th of May 1934 and was buried in the Jackson Family plot at the Amber Cemetery.

Marcellus Observer-Wednesday, August 15, 1934

The Sage up South, By E.E. Wicks "Mort Jackson"

There may be a question as to whether the farmer's Six Town Picnic, held this Wednesday, August 15, 1934 marks the 50th anniversary or the 49th year. Since those old timers met for the first Farmer's Picnic held at Davis Grove on the Shore of Otisco Lake?

Since the recent passing of Mortimer Jackson who was the last of the surviving members of the original picnic committee selected in 1885, leaves no one to dispute what we say. And since this is the 50th picnic that has been held, if we figure the same way some folks figure their birthday that they may only be 49 years old. But yet celebrate their 50th birthday.

We might properly give space in today's issue of the home paper to give a brief story of Mr. Jackson's life and pay tribute to the last survivor of the old original committee who looked forward to this 50th picnic.

Mr. Jackson came from that old pioneer stock that came westward from the Hudson Valley section, very early in the 19th century. His grandfather had a blacksmith shop in Navarino and died in 1811 and was buried in Jackson cemetery. He is the oldest marker in the little cemetery which occupies a knoll near the center of the old Jackson farm on the new Cherry Valley Turnpike about 1 mile west of Navarino. It was Mortimer's father who built this large, fine old colonial home in 1834 to take place of a large cabin in which he first lived. The home is a two-story broom frame structure. The boss carpenter received \$1.00 a day, while his helpers were only paid .50 cents for their days work.

Mortimer Jackson began keeping Day Journals when he was 16 years old. These old diaries show many happenings and prices of long ago. We find that when his father died, (Doode) Duane Wiltsie went to Marcellus for the casket and another party received \$2.00 for digging the grave. We also find Mort had preserved an auction bill of his father's personal property. There was 330 bushels of winter wheat, 140 spring wheat, 440 bushels of oats, 500 bushels of corn, 25 tons of Hay, 35 acres of wheat on the ground, 200 bushels of winter apples, and 5 casks of old cider. Which showed that these old farmers, who carried on their operations more like the southern planters, wore high top boots, barn door britches, a white shirt, and stovepipe hat everyday formed in no mean way or needed the AAA or NRA to pull them out of a depression. Mort Jackson married Etta VanBuskirk in 1871, and for a time lived on the Jerome Jackson farm recently purchased by Ralph Chapman later he purchased the farm on Oak Hill in the Town of Otisco, where he lived for more than 60 years, and passed away last May at the age of 86. Survived by two daughters: Mrs. Jessie Kelley of Staten Island, and Mrs. Mary Stegner of Lockport, NY. Three sons; Clermont of Navarino, Ceylon of Long Island; and Donald of Washington, D.C. of the large Jackson family only one remains, Mrs. Abigail Ramsden of Navarino.

Mr. Jackson's activities were not confined to the farm alone. We find that he was a wool buyer, also bought wheat and traded, bought, and sold livestock while engaged in growing

crops on the farm. Away back nearly 50 years ago, he and his lifelong friend Addison Newman leased Davis Grove and furnished pleasure and entertainment to the public. When they dissolved partnership, Mr. Newman used his proceeds from the late venture to put the first steamboat on Otisco Lake. Mortimer used his proceeds to build a home in Marcellus also known as Dr. Kelsey home. Here he expected to retire to a quiet village life, but fate decreed otherwise.

Mr. Jackson's wife died about this time. A little later he married Miss Emily Hotchkiss, who died in 1898. For nearly 30 years Mr. Jackson lived alone much of the time and carried on his farm work well past 80 years of age. E.E. Wicks

So sure, as comes around each year, so sure comes James M. Jackson with long green in his hand to pat subscriptions for himself, Clermont, Mrs. Kelly at Stapleton, and Mrs. Stegner at Lockport. It was over a month ago that he came in with Clermont to arrange for the bills for the auction which he held. Clermont told me something about his dad that I did not dare till after this arrival call for fear Mr. Jackson would lick me. Now that he has come and gone safely, I may give it out. As the hour approached for the auction to begin "Mort" said to Clermont "Now when the sale begins, I shall go over in the woods and do a little chopping for a few hours, so you needn't mind if you miss me", "I'll be back after a while." He counted bear to face the music. And see his beloved farm and barn tools go. But he stood it all real bravely and comes out in good shape after all. He has lately been to visit Ceylon's family in Binghamton; they teased him to stay longer. Mrs. Jackson's early home was there. Ceylon is a civil engineer and is lately surveying on Long Island, so was only a few days while his father was there. Alvra Jackson drove his grandfather down to Binghamton and went after him.

Marcellus Observer, John Hamilton has leased the Gratzner farm, just west of Navarino. This is better known as the old Jackson homestead. Only two survive of this fine old

family, of which there were 19 children, Mrs. Abbie Ramsden of Navarino, and our old friend Mortimer Jackson of Oak Hill. He is still very much alive, though more than four score winters had hurled their icy blasts at the sturdy old scion of early days. Mort Jackson's father like the Fish's was one of the early settlers.

This remarkable old Jackson house still has the large chimneys on either end, built for fireplaces; also at least one of the original fireplaces is still in working order. There is also a very old cemetery, known as the Jackson Cemetery, surmounting a low hill just back of the house, which is still used as a neighborhood burying ground. Mr. Jackson still has the long table around which the family ate their frugal fare.

Benjamin Jackson 1803-1897 (Generation 2)

Benjamin Jackson (1803-1897) was born on November 30, 1803 in Duaneburg, Schenectady County, New York. He was the fourth son of James and Ruth Ellison Jackson.

Benjamin and wife, Wealthy, moved from Onondaga County to Orleans County in 1825 where brother James had located in the township of Ridgeway in 1823. Benjamin cleared 100 acres, purchased from the Holland Land Company. The couple remained on the farm until 1842 when Wealthy died. Benjamin and Wealthy had no children.

Benjamin married Clarissa McCormick and purchased land in the village of Medina to the south of Ridgeway where he lived the remainder of his life.

In 1825, his brother James Jackson convinced him to move to Orleans County. James Jackson had relocated there in the town of Ridgeway, NY in 1823.

Benjamin Jackson purchased 100 acres from the Holland Land Co., which was good land and thickly covered with virgin timber. He cleared his land and remained on his farm until 1842, when his wife died. Wealthy and Benjamin were not blessed with any children.

There were no roads in Orleans County when Ben first located there and the nearest store was in Middleport, NY. He moved at the opening of the Erie Canal, he would mark a trail through the woods by blazing trees to find his way to and from the store to his log home. After the loss of his first wife, Ben married Clarissa McCormick, in 1842; he bought a piece of land in the village of Medina and later a farm of 78 acres. In 1860, he built a home in Medina where he lived for the remainder of his life. He and Clarissa had 9 children: 7 girls and 2 boys, two of them were twins. Benjamin died at his home in Medina on the 7th of February 1897 and Clarissa died 11 yrs. later.

Amos Jackson 1806-1893 (Generation 2)

Amos Jackson (1806-1893) was born on January 17, 1806 in Duanesburg, Schenectady County, New York. He was the fifth son of James and Ruth Ellison Jackson.

Amos Jackson was a farmer and possibly a veteran.

Amos Jackson married Anna Hunt on January 16, 1828 in the town of Onondaga, NY by Russell B. Johnson. (Onondaga Register January 16, 1828)

Anna Hunt was born on March 2, 1805 in Washington, NY and died on May 28, 1881 in Danforth Village, Onondaga County, NY.

Amos died of Bright's disease on the 3rd of March 1893. He was 87 years 1 month and 14 days. He married Anna (Annie) Hunt; she was the daughter of J.L. Hunt. Annie was born on the 2nd of March 1805 in Washington, NY, and died on the 27th of May 1881 in Danforth Village. They had two daughters that we are aware of, Martha Jackson was born on the 10th of July 1833 in Hastings, Oswego County, NY, and died on the 13th of January 1866 in Syracuse, NY. She was 21 years 2 months and 6 days old. Martha died from Dysentery; she was originally buried in Rose Hill Cemetery in Syracuse. She was relocated to Oakwood Cemetery and buried with her parents when the city decided to relocate all the graves in Rose Hill to make way for a park. Amos and Annie's second daughter, Mary Jackson, was born on the 5th of June 1831, and she died on the 13th of January 1866 in Syracuse, NY. She was 34 years 7 months and 8 days. Mary was also buried in Rose Hill Cemetery and moved to Oakwood with her parents. My brother Donald and I were unaware of the existence of such a person and have very few facts about him. The history of the Orleans Co. Jackson's indicates that Amos was the first son of James. But that becomes less reliable as it gets away from Orleans County. that which convinces me of his existence is old letters that we have. From these letters, I learned that Benjamin's families were to spend Christmas with Amos and family in Syracuse and asked John's folks to meet them there. Mary married William J. Vroman, they had two daughters. Mary Estella Vroman was born on the 5th of December 1860 in Syracuse and died on the 7th of August 1862. She died from Dysentery like Martha and was also buried in Rose Hill and was moved to Oakwood to be reinterred with her grandparents. She was 1 year 11 months and 5 days old. Mary and William Vroman also had another daughter, Elma J. Vroman, she was born in September 1862. Elma married Alfred J. Brown. Amos also married again to a woman named Delia, after the death of Anna. All of them are now buried in Oakwood Cemetery in Section # 37 lot # 15.

Obituary, March 5, 1893 Syracuse Evening Herald:

Jackson, Amos – In this city on the 3rd inst. Amos Jackson, age 87 6 years 1 month, 4 days. Funeral at his residence, 101 Oakwood Avenue, Monday 3 p.m. Friends are invited.

Evening Herald, Saturday, March 18, 1893

Amos Jackson did not make a satisfactory distribution.

In Surrogate Glass's court this morning a contest was begun on the will of Amos Jackson, formerly a well-known and old resident of the Eleventh ward. Mr. Jackson left an estate valued at about \$8,000 according to the inventory filed. Of this amount \$8,500 was in real estate. The bulk of the estate was left to his grandchildren: Amos Vroman and Mrs. Brown. The widow, Mrs. Delia Jackson, was left \$2000 a year in? of dower by the terms of the will. She is not satisfied with this disposition of the estate. One hundred dollars was left a greatgrandchild, and he will enter protest to the probate of the will as well.

In court this morning, E. M. Wills appeared as counsel for Mrs. Jackson and Ceylon H. Lewis for the executor of the will, W. B. Crowley. The attorney for the constant was given till March? in which to file his objections.

Amos died on March 3, 1893 in Syracuse, Onondaga County, New York at 100 Oakwood Avenue and was laid to rest at the Oakwood Cemetery Syracuse, Onondaga County, NY.

The history of the Orleans County Jackson's states that Clarinda was the 6th child of James and Ruth Ellison Jackson. She was born on the 20th of February 1808 in Navarino, NY, and died on the 3rd of May 1898 in Hinsdale, Cattaraugus County, NY. I have read several places that she married a Mr. Wiley, I can add a little to that from personal information. While we were living in Sanitary Springs, NY, I knew a Wiley a relative. He visited father several times at the Oak Hill farm, He was a descendant of Clarinda's, but I am not sure of the relationship. In Ceylon's book he got this Clarinda mixed up with his grandfather's sister Aunt Clarinda Jackson who married William Amidon. Clarinda married Richard L. Wiley, they had five children; James Wiley was born in 1826 and died in February 1892. James was their oldest child of James and Clarinda. James married Matilda Ruckle on the 26th of December 1850 in West Sparta, NY. Matilda died young and James got remarried to Helen, she was born in 1846. James and Helen had two children; Matilda was born in 1865, and John J. was born in 1867. John married Elizabeth in California in 1889. They had a daughter Fannie E. she was born in 1889; Henry Wiley was born in December of 1832, and died at the age of 26 years on the 22nd of January 1909 in NY, In Orange County, CA. Millicent M. Bergmann was born on the 18th of August 1912 in NY, and died on the 30th of October 1946 in Orange County, CA.

Richard Jr. was born in 1834 in Chenango, NY and he died on the 14th of December 1881 in Danville, NY. Richard Jr. married Lucy Roberts she was born in 1841. They have seven children; Margie Wiley was born on the 8th of March 1863 in NY and died on the 23rd of June 1945 in Los Angeles. Margie married John Bermann in 1882, he was born in 1856. Margie and John had one son John Earl Bermann he was born on the 2nd of June 1883 in NY, and died on the 31st of July 1968 in Orange County, CA. at the age of 85 years. John Earl married Mable F. Stevens she was born on the 12th of February 1884 in Pennsylvania, and died on the 8th of August 1968 in Santa Clara, Orange County, CA. Millicent M. Bermann was born on the 18th of August 1912, and died on the 30th of October 1946 in Orange County, CA. and finally Lucille R. Bermann was born on the 15th of February 1911, and died on the 9th of October 1993 in Orange Co, CA. at the age of 82 years old. Richard and Lucy's other child was Arthur H. Wiley who was born in 1869, and married Martha V. born in 1859. Census records indicate they had no children.

Hattie M. Wiley was born on the 29th of June 1873, and died on the 9th of December 1956 in Ventura, CA. Hattie married a man named Hills, and had two sons; Richard L. was born in 1895, and William A. was born in 1903. Christopher Wiley was born in December of 1838 and died on the 17th of February 1922. Christopher married Mary J. Filer, she was born on the 2nd of

December 1840 and died on the 2nd of February 1881. They were married in 1875 and had two children; Louise was born in July of 1877 and Arthur C. was born in August of 1879. Arthur married Delia in 1906, she was born in 1887 and they had two children; Mary L. was born in 1908, and Arthur A. was born in 1910.

Christopher's 2nd wife was Angeline (Angie) Elizabeth Shafer, they married in 1882. She was born on the 14th of February 1849 and died on the 17th of February 1902. John Wiley was the son of Richard and Clarinda Jackson Wiley. John was born in February of 1842 and died on the 19th of July 1906. John married Rose C. Shafer she was born on the 13th of February 1842 and died on the 18th of January 1914. John and Rose had two children; Charles C. was born in September of 1865 and died on the 24th of May 1848. Charles married Anna C. Smith who was born on the 7th of May 1866 and died on the 4th of August 1920. Charles and Anna had two children; Caroline M. was born in July 1891, and Carl L. was born in December of 1892 in Rochester, and died on the 24th of May 1948. Carl married Blanche M. Lerch on the 26th of January 1916 in Rochester. Charles second wife was Nengah Lamb born in March 1876.

Francis S. Wiley was born on the 31st of March 1878 and died on the 26th of June 1918. Francis was the son of John and Rose C. Shafer Wiley, he married Jessie Susanna Endler. She was born on the 2nd of August 1879 and died on the 18th of October 1948. They had two children; Frank John was born on the 1st of March 1902 and died on the 20th of December 1960. Frank John married Elizabeth Marie Ferguson; she was born on the 18th of January 1945. Bessie as Elizabeth was known had a daughter Shirley. John married his second wife, Mary R. she was born in 1914 and died in 1985.

Richard Jr. and Lucy Roberts Wiley had four other children; Lulu was born in 1879, Clarence H. was born in 1861, and died in 1869. Delbert was born in 1864, and died in 1869, and Shelly born in 1866 and died in 1868.

Rosalie Jessica Wiley was born on the 6th of February 1904 in Rochester and died on the 24th of April 1878. She was the youngest child of Francis and Jessie Endler Wiley. The name of Rosalie's first husband is not known. She married her second husband Benjamin Allen Watkins. He was born on the 22nd of October 1906 and died on the 22nd of November 1966. He was the son of John Loring Watkins (1871-1920) and Louisa "Lulu" Celia Maher (b-1877).

Benjamin and Rosalie were married in Baltimore, Maryland on the 31st of October 1945. Amelia J. Wiley was born in 1830 and died in September of 1892. She was the daughter of Richard and Clarinda Jackson Wiley. Amelia married George W. Porter he was born in July of 1820. The U.S. Civil War draft records state that George was a teacher. They had one son, Henry J. Porter he was born on the 17th of June 1853, and died on the 19th of December 1933. Henry married Livonia he was born in April of 1855. They had two children; Alfred G. was born in October 1896, and Lewis born in June of 1889 in NY. Clarinda, Christopher, Angie, Arthur are all buried in Hinsdale Cemetery, Maplehurst, Cattaraugus County, NY. Section # 2 Lot # 64 Grave 1-3
